Ever wished you could lay your hands on a directory that tells you what research CSIRO is doing? *CSIRO Research Programs 1979-80*, a new publication, does this most comprehensively.

This directory, which runs to more than 500 pages, describes all of the Organization's current research programs and sub-programs — there are more than 700 of them — says where they're happening, and provides details of the number of staff they employ and what

they cost. It also spells out possible implications of the research results — all with a minimum of technical language.

People in industry, government, and research and educational institutions should find it an invaluable source of information.
